TONN MEMORIAL

Members of the Tonn Memorial ad hoc committee and staff met with BEST engineering academy students and teacher Debra Crane at Galt High School on Monday to discuss the proposed memorial plaza and answer questions from the students. The students will be working on conceptual design ideas to present to the committee prior to the end of the school year.

TURF MAINTENANCE

Parks maintenance staff has completed the spring fertilization of turf areas in all parks, streetscapes, and facilities.

RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

Four building permits were issued to the Meadows Subdivision on May 15. They have one additional permit still in the plan check review process. Two more permits were issued in the Creekside 2, Unit 2 Subdivision bringing the total to seven.

SCHOOL STAFF FIREARMS FAMILIARIZATION

Two Firearms Familiarization classes were held this week on Tuesday and Thursday. The last two scheduled classes will be held May 22 and 23.

PUBLIC SAFETY DAY

Public Safety Day was held Saturday with participation from CHP, Sacramento County Sheriff, Coast Guard, the school bus garage, Cosumnes Services District and our own Parks and Recreation Department.
