ANNUAL UNMET TRANSIT NEEDS HEARING

Local transit operators and the Sacramento Area Council of Governments are looking for feedback to help plan and improve transit services in Sacramento County. The City's Annual Unmet Transit Needs hearing is scheduled for October 23 at 2:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers at 380 Civic Drive. Residents are invited to provide input on whether the local transit system is meeting community needs. Arrangements have been made to have Spanish language interpretation available.

NORTHEAST SPORTS PARK RENOVATION

Renovation of the athletic fields at the northeast sports park began October 15, following the City taking over maintenance responsibility for the Elementary School District on July 1. Weed control materials have been applied. The fields will be aerated and scalped after two weeks. Low areas will be filled in with topsoil and then seeding will take place. Another round of weed control materials will be applied prior to seeding. The fields will be closed at least sixty days to allow the new turf to become established.

CRACK SEALING

Staff will begin annual roadway crack sealing efforts the week of October 21. As part of this year's crack sealing program, staff has added the Market grounds. Crack sealing is the first line of defense in pavement preservation and is used on roads that are in "good" shape to keep water from reaching the asphalt base, which will help prevent base failure and extend the pavement life.

POLICE PATROL

Staff from the police department assisted Liberty Ranch High School students on a video project titled "every 26 seconds". This is a public service project surrounding the results of dropping out of high school. The video ends up with a robbery at the More for Less and the arrest of the truants, by our officers and booking at the police department. This project went very well with minimal disruption to the store operations.
