JAYCEE HALL DEMOLITION

The contractor will begin the demolition of the old Jaycee Hall (at 405 Fifth Street) on November 12.

TWIN CITIES ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

Twin Cities Roundabouts construction is moving forward. Due to the time of year and the increased probability of rain, staff and the contractor have started discussing buttoning up the job for the duration of the winter. Some concrete work is scheduled for the week of November 11, with paving portions of West Stockton Blvd. expected to start the week of November 18. The paving for this section of West Stockton Blvd, north of Twin Cities, will allow the Hwy 99 On/Off ramp and West Stockton Blvd. to be re-opened to the public.

EDUCATION SUMMIT

The City of Galt, Galt Elementary and High School District co-sponsored a very successful first ever Galt Education Summit on Thursday evening that included a wide array of community leaders interested in the success of Galt area youth.
