WILTON RANCHERIA

A website has been created for the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process administered by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to analyze the potential environmental impacts of the Wilton Rancheria's (Tribe) application for a proposed 282-acre fee-to-trust transfer and casino project to be located in Sacramento County, to the north of the City of Galt. The proposed project site is adjacent to the western boundary of Highway 99, to the north of Twin Cities Road. 2013 WELL REHABILITATION

A pre-construction meeting was held on February 13, 2014, with Commercial Pump and Mechanical for the 2013 Well Rehabilitation project. A Notice to proceed will be issued for the first week in March.

MISTLETOE

Staff has identified 110 City trees that are infested with mistletoe. Of those, 15 will be removed due to the extent of infestation and decline. Staff have begun pruning mistletoe from the remaining 95 trees. Staff is working with the Sacramento Tree Foundation to obtain replacement trees for those removed, as well as trees previously removed at Lake Canyon and Canyon Creek Parks. Replanting trees will be a project included in the upcoming Helping Hands/Love Galt volunteer event that will take place in April.
