TWIN CITIES ROUNDABOUTS

The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE), Sacramento Section, has selected the Twin Cities Road/State Route 104 at State Route 99 Interchange Roundabouts, for the 2015 ASCE Community Improvement Project of the Year. This project was submitted by Omni-Means in consultation with the City. The project team will be honored at ASCE's banquet on February 25, 2015.

VINTAGE OAK LIFT STATION

Dependent upon weather and materials delivery, the contractor plans to begin installation of bypass pumping equipment next week. This will necessitate intermittent traffic control along Carillion Boulevard and Vintage Oak Avenue.
