### **UPRR REPAIR WORK**

The Elm Avenue road closure has been extended through June 28, due to unforeseen railroad scheduling conflicts. Notifications will be sent out as updated schedules become available.

### **CREEKSIDE SUBDIVISION – UNIT #3**

The developer's contractor has completed the underground work with road widening and paving continuing on Lincoln Way and Kost Road. The placing of the sidewalk is scheduled for later this week. Currently, seven houses are under construction with the masonry wall nearing completion. Removal of the barricade on Joy Drive is also scheduled soon, opening the road to its full width.

### **POLICE RECRUITING TEAM**

The Galt Police Department Recruiting Team attended the American River College Career night on Tuesday, June 21. There were 28 agencies from throughout California in attendance. This event allowed Recruiting Team members to interact with 22 eligible academy students who are actively attending the academy.

### **NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH**

On Monday, the Police Department hosted a monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting at Three Palms Mobile Estates on Pringle Avenue. Police have been working on reducing commercial trucks using Pringle Avenue, which is a "No Truck" route. While there has been steady improvement since taking various steps to address this specific issue, it is still on the list of priorities for the area.

The Police Department has partnered with local businesses in the industrial area; Cardinal Glass, BMD, Cal Waste, LL Wood, to improve the quality of life for the neighborhood and reduce the commercial truck traffic on Pringle Avenue.

Representatives from Cardinal Glass and Cal Waste along with Chief Sockman, CAPS/Grandma Cop Volunteer, Terry Esparza and Crime Prevention Coordinator, TJ Guidotti, were on hand to work with local partners and answered various quality of life related questions.
