

CITY MANAGER'S WEEKLY UPDATE

August 17, 2012

SLURRY SEAL PROJECT

The City mailed notification letters this week to over 1,300 residents to inform them of the slurry seal pavement rehabilitation work on their streets expected to begin the week of August 20th. The notification letter has a website link <http://www.ci.galt.ca.us/index.aspx?page=821> which provides PDF maps of the locations and spreadsheets of the construction schedule. In addition to the City's notification letter, the contractor will provide a 48-hour door hanger notification prior to construction. Slurry Seal work is scheduled for Carillion, Walnut, Galt Market parking lot and dozens of residential streets along with a heavier cape seal on F Street.

DEADMAN GULCH TRAIL CONNECTION PROJECT

The Deadman Gulch Trail Connection Project has been completed. The project installed two mid-block crosswalks and rectangular rapid flashing warning lights on Carillion Blvd. These features will enhance pedestrian and bicycle safety at this popular location. The \$115,000 project was funded with a \$100,000 grant from the Sacramento Area Council of Government (SACOG) Community Design Grant.

NOTABLE ARRESTS

Officers served a search warrant just outside the city limits Wednesday evening. Over 200 marijuana plants were seized along with packaging material and four weapons. One suspect was arrested.

A probation search Thursday resulted in the arrest of an out of town subject coming into our city to sell drugs. He was arrested in possession of methamphetamine and a large sum of cash.

CHABOLLA ADA ACCESS

An ADA automatic push button door has been installed at the Chabolla Community Center as part of the City's ongoing ADA compliance efforts.

S.O.A.R. AFTER SCHOL PROGRAM

The new SOAR after school program is designed to provide students supervised activities to bridge the time from when school ends until they are able to be picked up. SOAR is being offered at Lake Canyon, Marengo, and River Oaks Elementary Schools everyday after school when school is in session (M, T, Th, F from 2:30-6:00pm and W from 1:00-6:00pm). Participants must be enrolled as students at that particular school in order to register for SOAR. Program fees are due monthly (\$115 per participant) and are due the last Thursday of the preceding month. Registration fees will cover 100% of the costs of the program. Space is limited! Initial registration must be done in person at the Parks & Recreation Department office. For more information, please call 366-7180.

ASES AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

The ASES after school program is going on its fourth year and is entirely grant funded. It is designed to provide students academic help to become proficient in Math, English and STAR Testing. ASES is offered at Greer, Valley Oaks Elementary Schools and McCaffrey Middle School everyday after school when school is in session (M, T, Th, F from 2:30-6:00pm and W

from 1:00-6:00pm). Participants must be enrolled as students at that particular school in order to register for ASES. This Program is free but space is limited. Students that are not proficient in Math, English and STAR Testing are given preferential enrolment. This Program is primarily run through the School District but utilizes Parks and Rec Employees to supervise.
